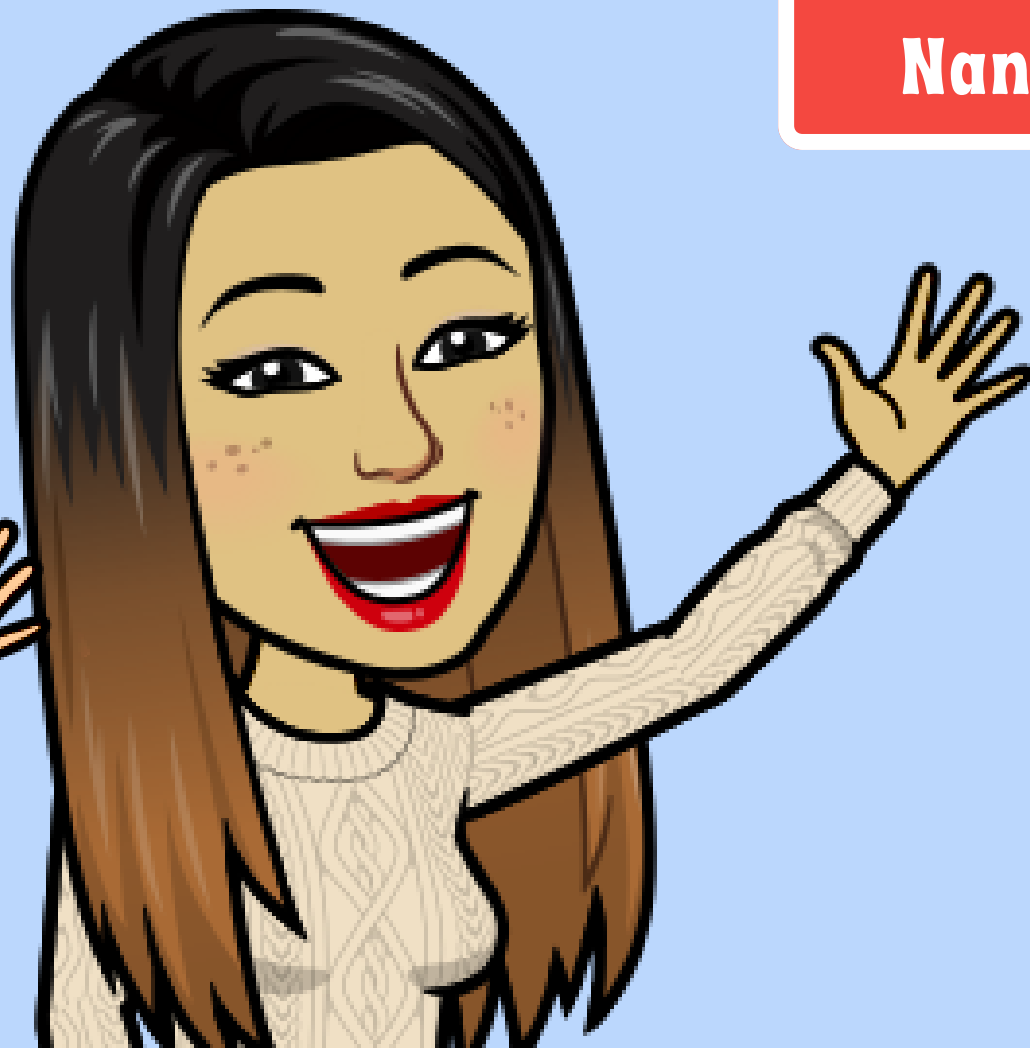

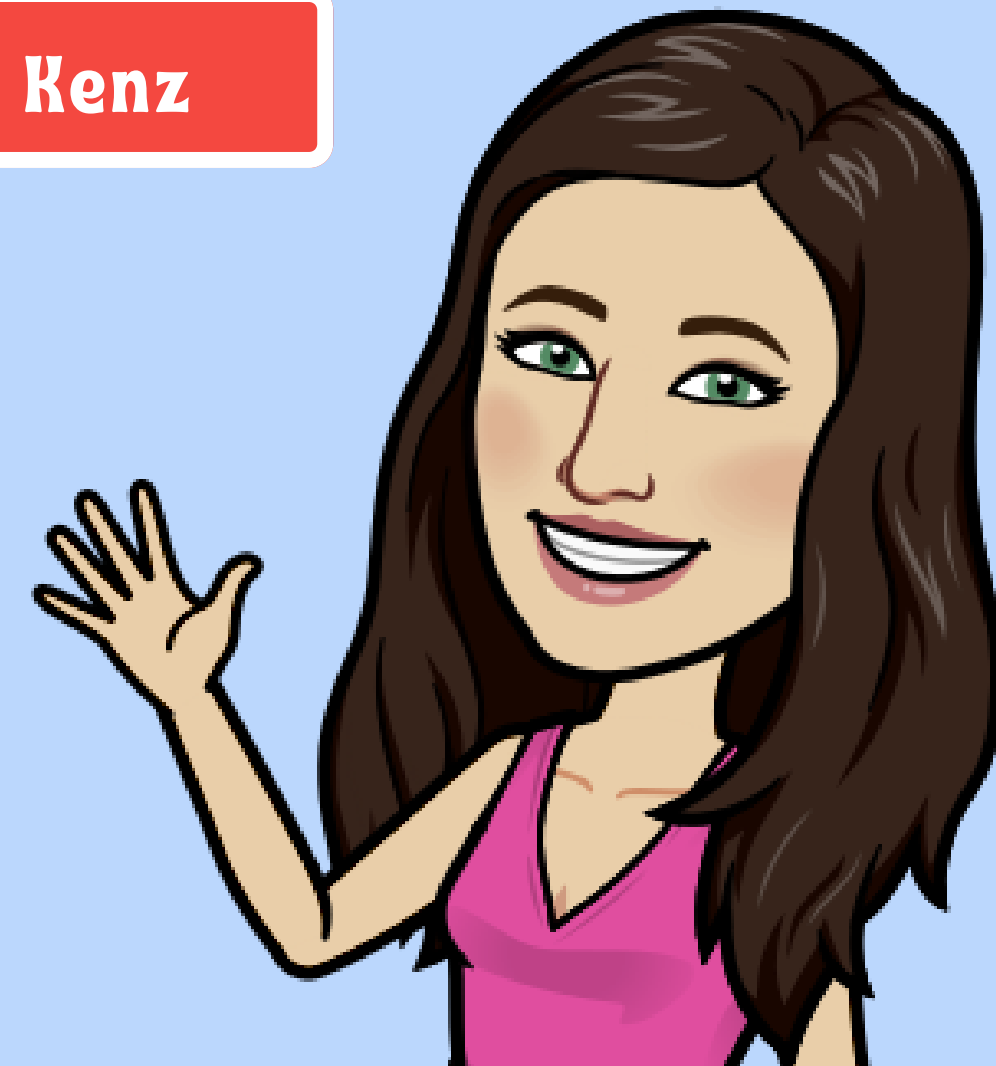

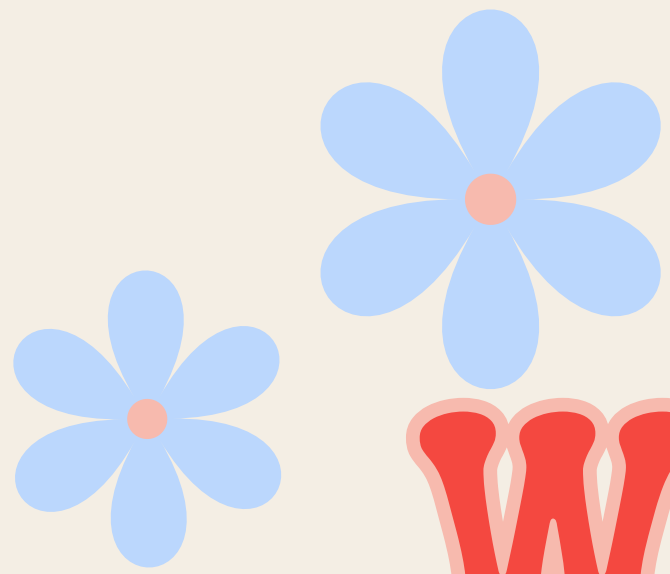

Expand access to quality, affordable early care and education.




Maternal Health

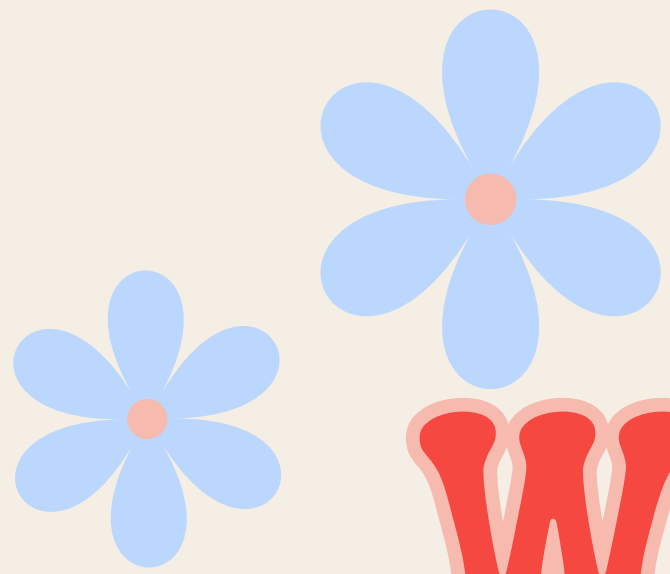

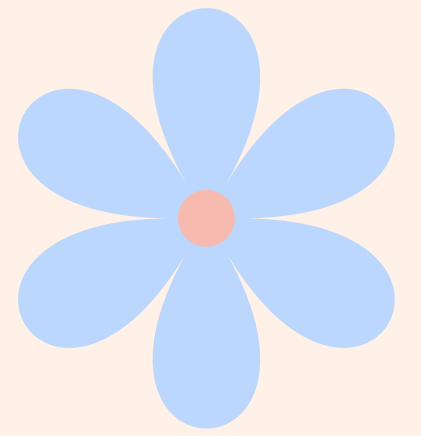
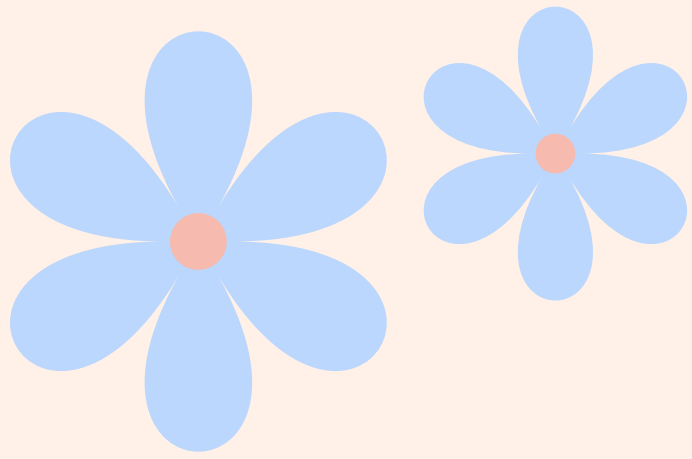

VOTERS ON THE ISSUES

Early Care and Education:

81% of parents feel more favorable about a candidate who supports increased funding for child care

(Save the Children Action Network, July 2024)

Maternal Health:

75% of voters support prioritizing maternal health care
84% support improving maternal health data collection & research
85% support expanding the number of providers trained in maternal health

(Data for Progress, April 2022)

Paid Leave:

80% of voters want politicians to prioritize investing more in caregiving policies like paid leave and tax credits

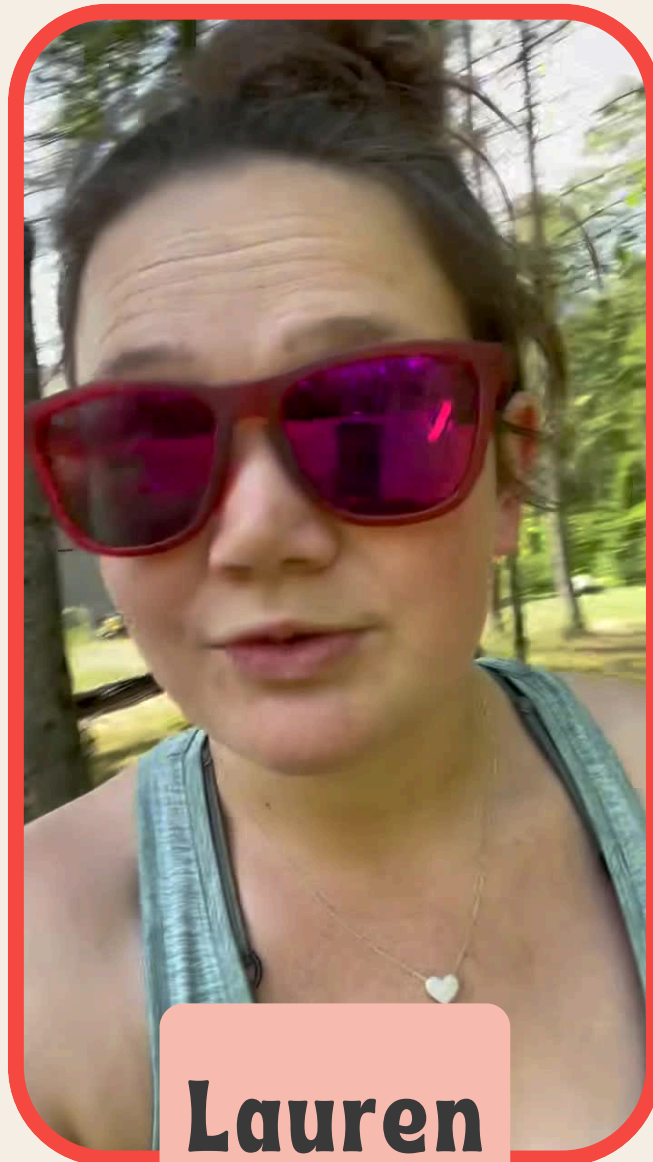

2/3 of voters support taxing the wealthiest 1% to pay for caregiving priorities such as child care, elder and disability care, and paid family and medical leave
